

# 2017 Pacesetter Winter Basketball Classic

## General Information

### Facility

Clemens Fieldhouse and Clair Lynch Gym both located in the Haehn Campus Center at St. Ben's.

### Admission

An ALL-Day pass is \$7.00 for ADULTS and \$5.00 for STUDENTS K-12. Children who have not yet attended kindergarten are free.

### NO FOOD OR COOLERS ALLOWED!

Please help avoid any embarrassing situations by letting all parents and players know this rule in advance. A full concession stand will be available. No food or drinks may be brought in from the outside except water or Gatorade for the players.

### Tournament Format

The tournament format will be determined by the number of teams that are registered and paid on the Monday prior to the tournament. The maximum number is 16. The minimum number of teams to conduct a full tournament is 4. With 4-16 teams, a bracket will be created to provide all teams 3-4 games. With 4-6 teams, pool play would be held involving shorter games. With pool play, all teams would be guaranteed the *equivalent* of 3-4 full games. Starting time will be clearly posted. Teams are asked to be at their court 15 minutes prior to game time.

### Check-in

Teams should check in upon arrival. All waivers must be turned in at the check-in table. Roster need to filled out by Friday before the tournament online by following this link <https://psmbbn.wufoo.com/forms/winter-classic-team-roster/>

### Practice basketballs

Teams **should** bring their own practice basketballs, which are the responsibility of each team.

### Game uniforms

Teams should also bring two colors of uniforms in the event teams match the same color. Reversible jerseys are ideal. Numbers are required.

### Awards

Teams that win their tournament will receive a team trophy. Other top finishers will receive individual medals with neck ribbons.
