Boys hoops: CDH, T-G, Albany, Cherry No. 1

Defending champions Totino-Grace in Class 3A and Cherry in 1A are ranked No. 1 at the outset of the boys basketball season. Cretin-Derham Hall gets the early nod in the large school class and Albany in 2A.

The MBBN Boys rankings will be compiled by Ron Haggstrom of the Star-Tribune this year while Kevin Anderson continues to do the girls rankings.

Class 4A

Cretin-Derham Hall, which has three state titles, most recently 2018, returns two stars from a 25-6 state tournament team and has added two high-impact transfers. JoJo Mitchell, 6-foot-2 junior guard, was Suburban East Conference player of the year last season, averaging 20 points, four assists and five steals. Monteff Dixon, 6-foot-6 senior forward, averaged 14 points and 10 rebounds.

The Raiders picked up North Dakota's Gatorade player of the year, 6-foot-11 senior center Tommy Ahneman, who transferred from Fargo Sheyenne, where he averaged 22 points, 13 rebounds, and six

blocks. Recruited by numerous Division I teams, he committed to Notre Dame. The Raiders also added Ty Schlagel, 6-foot-6 sophomore forward who averaged 11 points for Eden Prairie as a freshman.

Ranked second is Wayzata, the best 4A team in the state

last year before being upset by Minnetonka in the state finals. The Trojans graduated five of their top eight, including Mr. Basketball Jackson McAndrew, but regroup around a core of three double digit scorers, Christian Wiggins, Wyatt McBeth and Isaac Olstead. No. 3 Hopkins, stopped by Wayzata in the section last season, returns over 70 ppg from a 23-6 team in Anthony Smith (23 ppg), Jayden Moore (19.4), JJ Semanko (16.6) and Davie Hart (12.0), all guards.

Class 3A

Totino-Grace is top ranked in Class 3A, having captured three consecutive state titles after never winning one previously. Their Mr. Basketball finalist Isaiah Johnson-Arigu has moved on to college ball at Miami, and sharpshooter Tyler Wagner (13.5 ppg) transferred to Champlin Park. They return plenty of firepower led Minnesota Basketball News

by 6-foot-6 junior forward Dothan Iiadimbola (12.9 ppg), 6-foot-2 senior guard Chase Watley (12.8)ppg) and 6-foot-4 junior guard Tian Chatman (9.4 ppg). Daniel Zoa, 6-foot-4 forward who averaged 15 points Legacy for Christian as an eighth-grader, transferred in.

Mankato East, runner-up to Totino-Grace last year, is ranked second, led by dynamic 6-foot-1 point guard Mad-Brogan

son (16.4 ppg), and 6-foot-5 forward Gandon Gosch (10 ppg). Three starters graduated but the top four subs return. Ranked third is Alexandria, fourth at state last year, led by 6-foot-8 forward Chase Thompson, a Clemson recruit, who averaged 18.9 points, and cousins Talan Witt and Mason Witt at guard. Also in the top five in a deep field are Orono, led by Nolan Groves, 6-foot-4 guard who averaged 27 points, eight rebounds and five assists last year, and always-strong DeLaSalle.

Class 2A

Ranked one-two in Class 2A are the last two champions, Albany, which captured its first state title in 2023, and Breck, which captured its first in 2024.

Albany returned to state and placed third last season with a 30-3 record. They are led by two seniors who made the all-tourney team on the 2023 championship team as sophomores, 6-foot-3 guard Zeke Austin (19.9 ppg last year) and 6-foot-7 Sam Hondl (17.4).

Breck graduated Mr. Basketball finalist Daniel Freitag (now with Wisconsin) but returns the other four starters who combined for almost 50 points per game: junior guard Hanif Muhammad (16.2 ppg), senior guard Miles Newton (13.2), sophomore forward JP Musoke (11.6) and junior guard DeAngelo Dungey (7.9).

Caledonia, ranked third, is ready to challenge, led by four returning all-conference players from a 23-5 team: guards Reid Klug and Mason King and forwards Ethan Stendel and Garrett Konz.

Class 1A

Cherry has gone to state three straight seasons and broke through for their first championship last season. Their superstar guard Isaac Asuma, a Mr. Basketball finalist, is now playing for the Gophers, but the other four starters are back and the Tigers are the logical early pick for No. 1. They 6-foot-2 feature senior guard Noah Sundquist (18 ppg), 6-foot-1 junior guard Carson Brown (12.6 ppg), 6-foot-1 junior guard Noah Asuma (14 ppg) and 6-foot sophomore guard Isaiah Isaiah Asuma and Cher-Asuma (13.5 ppg).

Dawson-Boyd, ranked sec-

ond all last season, was an upset victim in the sectional (by Minneota) and finished 26-3. The Blackjacks remain a premier contender, led by versatile 6-foot-6 senior Brayson Boike, who averaged 26 points and 11.5 rebounds. Also back are 6-foot-7 senior forward Drew Hjelmeland (17.2 ppg), 6-foot-1 junior point guard Gunner Liebl (18 ppg) and 6-foot soph guard Carson Stratmoen (6.0 ppg).
